eTwinning

Miss Forde's Third Class and Ms. Kenny's Fourth Class are taking part in an eTwinning project with a school in France. eTwinning is an online community for schools in Europe and offers a platform for children and schools across many European countries to communicate, collaborate, develop projects, share and, in short, feel and be part of an exciting learning community in Europe.

This project involves sharing and comparing aspects of Irish and French culture including through music, video, dance, architecture and traditions. It is hoped then that the French students will then visit St. Kevin's G.N.S. in Spring 2019, as part of a school tour to Dublin.

Numeracy

School Self Evaluation (SSE)

As you may already know, one of St. Kevin's G.N.S.'s chosen School Self Evaluation areas is 'Improving Problem-Solving Skills in Mathematics Through the Use of Digital Technologies in Teaching and Learning'. Stage Four of the School Self Evaluation process (Write and Share Report and Improvement Plan) is now near completion. The next stage of the S.S.E. process is Stage Five (Put Improvement Plan into Action) will formally commence after the Easter holidays.

From Easter to the Summer Holidays, in addition to problem-solving strategies in place in the classes, all students will explore Maths in the Environment through using their 'Maths Eyes' in and outside of the classroom. We hope to organise Maths' Trails and activities to explore the importance to seeing the value of Maths outside of the classroom and in everyday life.

Digital School Excellence Project

We have made great progress on our Digital Schools' Excellence Project this term. Our project is linked to our School Self Evaluation process and aims to improve creative problem-solving skills through digital technologies in teaching and learning practices in our school.

This term, Junior classes used programmable robots called Beebots in Maths, Aistear and other areas, while middle and senior classes used physical problem-solving equipment called Izak9 Cubes to develop Mathematical skills.

In conjunction with the School Self Evaluation Improvement Plan, staff in St. Kevin's have drafted a Digital Learning Framework for the area, to assist teachers and the school in purposefully integrating the problem-solving and digital equipment into the classroom and school.

Third Class Visit Microsoft DreamSpace

As part of the Digital Schools' Excellence Project, six students from Third Class were invited to visit Microsoft Ireland's new educational experience 'DreamSpace' on the 1st April. This visit proved to be a very enjoyable day and it was fantastic to see our students once again voicing their opinions and showing their talents in STEM. The girls started off the day with a visit to Holy Trinity Primary School in The Gallops, to meet with students from other partner schools in the cluster. After a morning of problem-solving and technology activities, the girls travelled to Microsoft where they learned about the use of artificial intelligence, received a tour of the campus, participated in a number of fun activities and more. The girls were commended for their interest and enthusiasm for technology and were invited back for another visit soon. Check out the school's twitter account for lovely photographs of the occasion.

School Inclusion Therapy Demonstration Project

The school has participated in the demonstration project involving multi-disciplinary supports including speech and language therapy and occupational therapy. It has proved to be a very beneficial and positive experience. We hope to participate in this project for a further year.

Public Library

The mobile library recently visited our school under a new collaborative approach. They provide information for primary schools and parents. The library also provides ongoing library programmes and initiatives I.e. The National Summer Stars Reading Programme and Family Time. The Summer Stars Reading Adventure runs throughout the summer and is a fun reading programme open to all children who register with their local library.

It is designed to create a healthy eating culture within schools and homes. Members of our Active School Committee will help administer the programme and will distribute the fruit and vegetables to classes each day.

Phase 1 will begin on Wednesday May 1st for Junior Infants, Senior Infants and First Class. It will continue for sixteen days until May 23rd. The rest of the classes will begin the programme on May 14th.During phase 1, the pupils sample one fruit and vegetable each day. Please encourage your child to try a cupped handful of the fruit or vegetable. They will be rewarded with stickers or prizes. They are also encouraged to keep a diary of the fruit and vegetables they eat at home. The programme will be explained in greater detail in a letter each child will bring home.
