In June, we held a 'Maths Eyes' competition as part of our School Self Evaluation plan to promote Maths and problem-solving in the school.

The 'Maths Eyes' initiative, aims to change the view of Mathematics as being something everyone does in school. With 'Maths Eyes', children can see the Mathematics they do every day. It builds confidence in Maths and encourages children to use the real world as a starting point for Maths.

The schoolwide competition involved taking a photo of Maths in the real world. The photo may have included a caption or a question.

There were great prizes and a prize-giving for the winning entries from each class level and an overall class prize to win the 'Golden Calculator'! Well done to all the girls that entered!

Student Council

Well done to all the girls who took part in the student council during this school year. Student Council is a great way for students to become involved in affairs of the school and has really benefited the school this year, representing their classes. It can now roll a dice and hang from a chair. They grow up so fast! The VEX Robotics team competed with the team in St. Kevin's B.N.S., in a nail-biting robot derby with a debatable winner! Active Week

Active Week took place in St. Kevin's G.N.S. between the 27th and 31st May 2019 to promote being active at home and at school for our pupils. Students in St. Kevin's were permitted to wear their tracksuits all week and took part in lots of fun activities and games. Here are examples of some of the activities that took place during the week

Classes walked/ran around the school yard at different times during the school day. We set a daily target distance and by the end of the week we had walked the distance to reach Brussels. School target was 1,000 km. We put a map in the hall to plot our progress and measured our laps each day. Whole school dancing was also popular daily event in the yard at 12:30.

The Active School Committee provided extra play equipment for use during yard time. Every class decided to do the 10@10 activities from Operation Transformation each day. Physical Homework was set each day instead of some other item.

School Improvement

Numeracy

We have just completed Year One of our chosen School Self Evaluation area in Numeracy. Our area for improvement chosen is 'Improving Problem-Solving Skills in Mathematics Through the Use of Digital Technologies in Teaching and Learning'.

Stage Four of the School Self Evaluation process (Write and Share Report and Improvement Plan) is now complete and the next stage of the S.S.E. process is Stage Five (Put Improvement Plan into Action) formally commenced after the Easter holidays.

Throughout the year, our pupils have participated in a variety of Mathematics-related activities to specifically improve problem-solving abilities. These activities have included using Beebots, Izak9 Cubes, coding and using specific problem-solving strategies across the school.

Since Easter, all students explored Maths in the Environment through using their 'Maths Eyes' in and outside of the classroom. Every class took part in Maths' Trails and activities to explore the importance to seeing the value of Maths outside of the classroom and in everyday life were organised and enjoyed by all classes. There was also a Maths Eyes photo competition, with fantastic entries from Second to Sixth Class.

We are looking forward to continuing with our School Self Evaluation in Numeracy in September. Thank you to the students, parents and staff for their support in this process this year.

Well-Being in St Kevin's G.N.S.

We are currently working on our policy on well-being as part of our school improvement plan. We have surveyed pupils and used the evidence gathered to help us identify our strengths and to help us to develop our improvement plan. We have used the Weaving Well-Being Programme in classes from Third to Sixth. It is an Irish designed positive mental health programme which aims to enhance well-being in pupils within the framework of the S.P.H.E. curriculum. Yoga and mindful meditations have also been introduced.

Writing Genres

The focus of the school's Self Evaluation and School Improvement Plan is to sustain and build on the high levels of teaching and learning in the school. The staff in fulfilling the recommendation in the Whole School Evaluation report, prioritised Writing Genres as the first target in the School Improvement Plan. Teaching and Learning were the areas selected.

Our theme was Teacher's Practice and we selected teaching approaches. Our evaluation criteria were learning outcomes in three writing genres (<u>Procedural, Explanation and Persuasive</u>). These expected outcomes were achieved during lessons.

Using the writing genres framework all pupils were involved in learning activities to revise, discover, learn and experiment with three writing genres procedural, explanatory and persuasive. Each teacher used the Handbook on Writing Genres or availed of the writing genres booklet on PDST site. Reading material connected to each genre was used in the classroom. Classes focused on one writing genre per term. The first seven weeks of Term One was spent recalling the genres worked on in 2017-2018 which were Recount, Report and Narrative.

There was a progression in pupils' learning as they moved from class level to class level. Curriculum appropriate teaching and learning methodologies with a focus on the Seven-Step Approach were incorporated into the lesson structure. These steps include familiarisation with the genre, analysing the framework for each genre, modelled writing, shared writing, guided writing, independent writing and presentation to an audience. Each class teacher from Junior Infants to Sixth class tracked three children three times during the year using the developmental indicators for the different classes and took into consideration the framework required for the different genres. Samples from each class were filed and progress monitored. Writing samples were displayed on noticeboards. The varying needs and abilities were catered for in the course of the lessons through the use of differentiation. Teachers enabled pupils to use relevant and necessary resources including ICT to support their learning. Learning outcomes were shared with the pupils regarding outcomes, criteria and feedback. These assessment outcomes were analysed and used to inform subsequent learning experiences for pupils. There was purposeful development achieved in the three writing genres selected for the year 2018-2019 as indicated in the samples displayed on the writing noticeboard and samples in genre folder.

Children's Reading Activities at Tallaght Library

'Summer Stars' is the National Reading Programme running until the end of August. It hopes to encourage children to read over their Summer holidays, enjoy the fun and pleasure of reading and participate in related events and activities in their local library. Available free of charge to all children, they just keep a record of the books they read on their reading card and children get encouragement and recognition for each step along the way. At the end of the programme, all children who participated will receive their own certificate of achievement at a special awards event.

Healthy Eating Policy

Key Messages for Healthy School Lunches.

- Lots of fruit and vegetables.
- Brown is best when it comes to bread, pasta or rice.
- A small treat is permitted on Fridays.
- Fizzy drinks and crisps are not allowed.
- Be aware of the high sugar content of cereal bars and avoid them.
- Milk, water or fruit juice without added sugar are best.
- Nuts are not permitted because of allergens.
- Good hygiene such as washing hands and using tissues are recommended.
- Infants are asked not to bring in food and drinks which they cannot easily open including Muller Corners, Frubes and drink pouches such as Capri Suns.

It is intended to create positive associations with fruit and vegetables among the pupils. The health benefits are emphasised throughout the programme.
